EARLY BEHAVIOURISM

- Established by Watson
- Two Subsystems- Primary and Secondary
- Primary Subsystem- it had two major aspects
- Positive and negative
- Positive Aspect- emphasis on objective psychology
- Negative Aspect- rejection of introspection

- Watson's primary system spelled out clearly the definition of psychology, methods of psychology and emphasized the major postulates of psychology, principles of selection as well as took special interest in mind-body problem.
- Secondary Subsystem-
- It mainly emphasized upon language development, thinking, environmentalism and determinism.

Watson's experimental programme

- Studies in the field of learning, emotion and memory
- Two basic principles
- Frequency and recency
- He explained that there are three basic emotions which are present at birth i.e. fear, rage and love
