1. Proper Division of Work :-

According to specialization. It will increase output.

2. Authority :-

Right & power to achieve their responsibilities.

3. Discipline :-

Exp. – Army

4. Unity of Command :-

An employee should receive order from one superior only.

5. Unity of Direction :-

One head / Direction and one plan should lead a group of activities. Exp. – College Plan development Education.

6. Subordination :-

Individual interest to general interest. Group interest is important.

7. Remuneration of Personnel :-According to designation, qualification & responsibilities. 8. Centralization :-Centralization & Decentralization. 9. Scalar Chain :-Highest to the lowest. Also known as Chain of command.

10. Order :-

Place for every one -Every one in his / her place.To avoid loss & waste – A place for everything and everything in its place.

11. Equity :-

Justice & Kindliness. 12. Stability of tenure of personnel : -10-20 years in one So more efficiency.

13. Initiatives :-

Freedom to share our ideas. Management should welcome all new ideas. Librarian should take initiatives Other subordinate will follow.

14. Esprit De corps :-

Promote harmony. Discover & avoid those things that disturb harmony.
