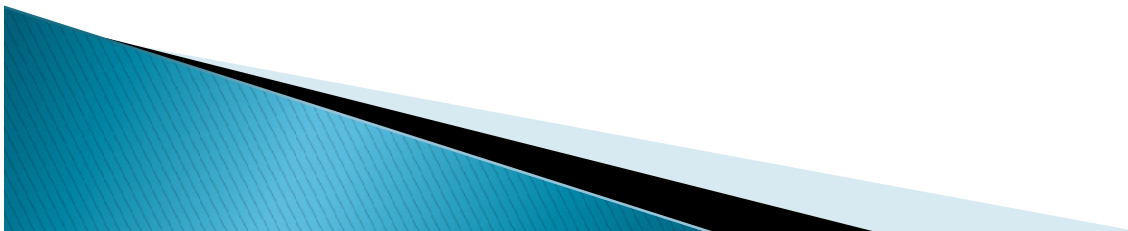

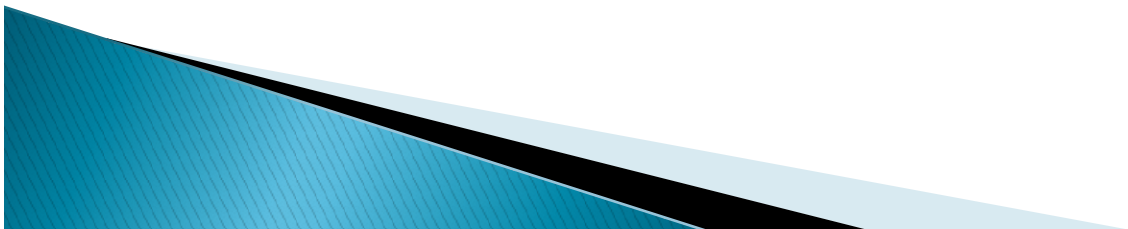
▶ DEFINITION AND MEANING

- ▶ The term biometrics is commonly used today to refer to the authentication of a person by analyzing physical characteristics such as fingerprints, or behavioral characteristics such as signatures.
 - ▶ Biometrics provide a more reliable system of authentication than ID cards, keys, passwords or other traditional systems.

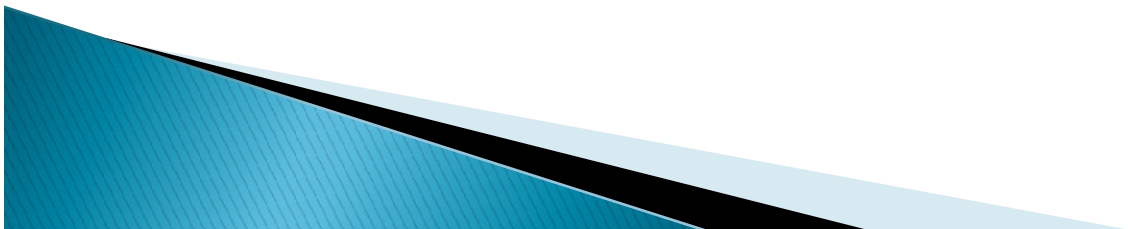
- ▶ A biometric is any measurable, robust, distinctive, physical characteristic or personal trait of an individual that can be used to identify or verify the claimed identity.
- ▶ Biometric authentication refers to automated methods of identifying or verifying the identity of a living person in real time based on a physical characteristic or personal trait.



- ▶ The word 'biometrics' is derived from the Greek word 'bios' and 'metric' which means life and measurement respectively. This directly translates into life measurement.
- ▶ Biometrics is an automated method of identifying a person or verifying the identity of a person based on physiological or behavioral characteristics.



- ▶ Examples of physiological characteristics include hand or finger images, facial characteristics and iris recognition.
- ▶ Behavioral characteristics are traits that are learned or acquired.
- ▶ Dynamic signature verification, speaker verification and keystroke dynamics are examples of behavioral characteristics.
