PREFACE

Among fast growing developing countries, India is distinctive for the role of the service sector. Where earlier developers grew on the basis of exports of labour intensive manufactures, India has concentrated on services. Although there are other emerging markets where the share of services in GDP exceeds the share of manufacturing, India stands out for the size and dynamism of its service sector. The Book examine the structural transformation which takes place in total output and total employment of the Indian economy.

In line with the dominant trend of services- led growth, service sector in India has grown rapidly in the last two and half decades. The study will examine the role of service sector in various macro variables like GDP, employment, consumption, investment, total export and taxation over the period of 1950-2017. Present work minutely observe all the pros and cons of the service sector growth in India. Thus, the study fortified with disaggregated data going rigorously into structure, dynamics and linkage pattern of the tertiarization of Indian economy which is the need of the time.
