

- Skill development is the key to household productivity, employability and income earning opportunities for women and also for enhancing sustainable rural development and livelihoods.

Training overview -

- Center for women study gave training to the women of Dhar village. They were taught how to make the bangle hanger of macrome.
- This activity was held at anganwadi center in dhar village in which 60 women participated. They were given a kit including scissor, wool, beads, wooden rods, needles, threads, Macrome Roll, key chain making kit, Plastic kit. Every women participated with enthusiasm. 25 girls gave training to those ladies.
- This hanger is used to hang the clothes, to hang the tissue roll and also used in decoration.
- This macrome can also be prepared by cutting the strip of a saree or a drawstring (Naada)

- It can be made easily. Those ladies were taught how to make key-chain and hanger.
- Different types of designs can be created by making a knot in the macrome and can be sold in the market to earn money.
- Principal of the Dhar government school also participated in the program to motivate rural women.
- Every women prepared atleast one hanger and wool key-chain by themselves. They were too happy to learn how to make these hangers and keychains.

To enable participants about sewing machine technology – controlling and maintaining advance level sewing machine


Highlights:

In the developing and fast changing world, clothing has emerged out to be an area of presentation of one's confidence and identity. Therefore, people are recognizing the way they are dressed. The influence of film industry has further added the sense of consciousness for clothing. Therefore it is necessary to learn sewing machine basics and advances with professional person. Mr. hemant from Usha company delivered a lecture cum demonstration on new advances of sewing machine launched by Usha company along with basic details. Following major things were demonstrated to students:

Selection of appropriate attachments according to the garment requirements like binder, folder, and essential mechanism tools, etc.

- Optimize positioning and layout of materials to ensure smooth and productive working
- Stitch the correct materials in the right sequence as required by the product specification as per the specified stitch type (stitch classes), hems and seams
- Perform complex stitching operations with precision and accuracy
- Make adjustments promptly to ensure the stitching work matches the specification
- Maintain the required productivity and quality levels
- Ensure safe and secure handling of stitching machines and related tools and equipments like thread cutters, shears, seam rippers, etc.
- Use and maintain personal protective equipments as per protocol like nose masks, lock guard, etc.
- Check the workplace and work processes for potential risks and threats like physical injuries from the machine and tools, fire, etc.
- Identify and correct (if possible) malfunctions in sewing machines and other related equipment like loose stitch, missing parts, etc.

In this workshop Prof. Digvijay Bhatnagar also shared their views for learning opportunities and Dr. Dolly Mogra presented vote of thanks.



Advanced skills such as constructing zipper pockets, creating pleats, and attaching hardware were also introduced to students. Dr. Mamta kavdia and Ms. Vasudha Kansara demonstrated ;Customize the basic handbag shape for your own design; Pick the perfect lining fabric and interfacing; Add various types of pockets such as flap and slot pockets; Accessorize with handles and hardware; Sew a recessed zipper and other closures to participants. Loom Basics Training

Programme: Loom Basics Training: Pit Loom

Date: 25 to 30 December 2019

Venue: Shilpgram

Objectives:

- **★**To identify the parts of loom
- ➤To operate primary motions, secondary motions and auxiliary motions

Highlights:

Students of textile Designing and Fashion Merchandising learned the basics of weaving under the masterful and patient guidance of two skilled and experienced weavers from Bhujodi village in Kutch. They placed Pit loom for demonstration purpose in shilpgram, and on request and interst of students they were ready to give training to students. Students practiced on pit loom as per their scheduled time as the stall was nearby to college stall. Students were happy to get first hand training with skilled artisans. Following information were learnt by students- Handloom weavers use different kinds of looms to weave like Pit loom, Stand loom and frame loom.

The pit loom is placed on the ground and its two peddles in a dug pit were the weaver in leaning onto the wall and standing half inside pit. Pit loom weaving is said to be producing a good weaving because of the fabric woven holds the characters of the fibre and makes the fabric more breathable as the loom vibration tensions and the speed is close to the ground which indirectly ripples. Once the dye is completed, warp yarn is received and loaded to the beam were the old warp yarn is preserved for continuing the new cloth weaving. The yarns are knotted to the old yarn present in heddles and the beam is fixed to the handloom were the weaving process occurs.

Weaving is a interlocking of two separate yarns at right angles like wefting thread and warping yarn, which makes a cloth material. In handloom the weft yarn is spun to the small bobbins (prins) that is placed inside the wooden instrument called Shuttle. The weft yarn loaded Shuttle is moved between the warp yarns, which makes the weaving process, appear. The warp yarns are held by heddles in the loom. Alternate warp yarn is picked up by one heddle and rest of the other warp yarn is held by other heddles. The movement of the pedals moves two heddles up and down which makes the warp into two parts and opens a small passage every time the pedaling is done. That passage is where the shuttle is moved from right to left and left to right correspondingly. Thus the weft yarn is weaved and interlaced between the alternate warp yarns.

The shuttle can be moved by the hand or pushed with a force with small hand mechanism applied that is called Fly shuttle. Once the shuttle is moved the weft yarn is tightened and pushed towards the previous weaved yarn with the help of reed beater. Reed is a wooden block with tiny passages made for the warp yarn to insert. Reed is moved to and fro for tightening the weft yarn. This is like a repetitive process, which happens, only when a weaver pedals with the legs, moves the fly shuttle with his/her right hand and moves the reed beater with left hand. All these movements should occur in correspondence in order to acquire the smooth flowing of weaving process.





On May 21st this year, Arunima Sinha became the first female amputee to scale Mount Everest.

A former national level volleyball and football player, 26 year old Arunima Sinha's life took a drastic turn 2 years back. Thrown out of a moving train for resisting a robbery, Arunima was hit by a passing train. She recovered after being in a critical condition and fighting for her life for several days. Sadly, her left leg could not be saved.

But Arunima had no place for pity in her life. Determined to not let the unfortunate incident overtake her life, Arunima decided that she had to do something about it. She started training for her feat and under the guidance of Bachendri Pal became the first woman to climb Mount Everest with prosthetic legs.

Earlier, Arunima had also qualified for the post of Head Constable with the Indian Central Industrial Security Force (CISF). Through her grit and perseverance, Arunima has proved that disability cannot defeat her spirit and zest for life.

Why we find her inspiring:

- For not letting her misfortune discourage her and instead boldly overcoming her obstacles
- For proving yet again that women can do anything if they set their minds to it
- For reinforcing the fact that differently-abled people are as talented and as capable as everyone else

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



राष्ट्रीय सिलाई मशीन दिवस आज (13 जून) सिलाई मशीन बनी आजीविका कमाई के साथ नाम और शौहरत

सुई-धागा फिल्म को देखकर यह साबित हो जाता है एक सिलाई मशीन के जरिए एक परिवार को ही नहीं बिल्क उस क्षेत्र के लोगों को स्वरोजागर से जोड़ा जा सकता है। हाथ के हूनर ने सिलाई मशीन न केवल एक परिवार की आय का जरिया बनी बिल्क उस क्षेत्र की कई महिलाओं को जोडक़र उनकी दिनचर्या बदल दी। गाउन की सिलाई से लेकर फैशनेबल ड्रेस डिजाइनिंग से नया मुकाम हासिल किया।

इसलिए कहा जा सकता है वह दौर गुजर चुका है, जब युवाओं के सामने रोजगार का संकट था। आज के प्रतिसपर्धा के दौर में भले ही किसी को नौकरी न मिले, लेकिन स्वरोजगार के दरवाजे हर किसी के लिए खुले हैं। नौकरी चाहने वाला व्यक्ति स्वरोजगार के बल पर अन्य लोगों को आजीविका से जोड़ सकता है।

आधुनिकीकरण के दौर ने जिस तरीके से स्वरोजगारों को बढ़ावा दिया है, उससे अब यह संकट नहीं के बराबर रहा है। कई क्षेत्रों में अपने हूनर का उपयोग करते हुए या अपने पारंपरिक व्यवसाय को आगे बढ़ाते हुए युवाओं को देखा जा सकता है।

इसी दिशा में एक ऐसा हूनर है सिलाई। सिलाई अब केवल हाथों से ही नहीं बल्कि कई तरह की आधुनिक मशीनों से होनी लगी है। फैशन के दौर में सिलाई का ट्रेंड भी बदला है और आधुनिकता लिए यह व्यवसाय अब स्वरोजगार को जोडऩे वाला एक बड़ा सेक्टर के रूप में स्थापित हुआ है। पूर्व में जहां हाथ की सिलाई मशीन से घरों में सिलाई का कार्य होता था लेकिन समय के साथ तरह-तरह की सिलाई मशीनों के माध्यम से साधारण सिलाई नहीं बल्कि डिजाइनर कपड़ों को तैयार किया जा रहा है।

सिलाई के सेक्टर में नाम कमाते उद्यमियों को देख कर युवाओं में अब यह भावना भी नहीं रही कि पेशेगत काम को ही वे स्वरोजगार बनाएं। यही कारण है कि अब हर क्षेत्र में पेशे से जुड़े और परंपरागत लोग ही नहीं, बल्कि अन्य लोग भी इस सेक्टर में भविष्य तलाशते नजर आ रहे हैं।

सिलाई क्षेत्र में बेहतर कॅरिअर के लिए

- -कटिंग एंड टेलरिंग के साथ डिजाइनिंग की नॉलेज जरूरी।
- आर्ट का प्रोपर नॉलेज होना चाहिए ताकि स्केच आदि बनाकर डिजाइन तैयारी की जा सकें।
- बाजार में आ रहे कपड़ों के नए-नए डिजाइनों की जानकारी होनी चाहिए।
- अलग-अलग कपड़ों को जोडक़र किस तरह नए डिजाइन तैयार करने का हुनर भी आना चाहिए।

घर से बुटिक की शुरूआत

सिलाई का काम तो घर में भी शुरू किया जा सकता है, जब तक की मार्केट में ऐसी कोई जगह न मिले जहां बुटिक खोलकर काम किया जा सके। यह भी अनदेखा नहीं किया जा सकता कि कई महिलाएं घर में सिलाई का कार्य करती है। काम बढऩे के साथ वह अन्य महिलाओं या इस क्षेत्र जरूरतंद ऐसा करती भी हैं, लेकिन अच्छे स्तर पर काम करने के लिए या बुटीक खोलने के लिए आपको मार्केट का रुख करना पड़ेगा। इस काम के लिए ऐसी दुकान, जिसमें दो-तीन मशीनें रखने और उन पर काम करने की पर्याप्त जगह हो, उपयुक्त रहेगी।

आधुनिक मशीनों का बोलबाला:

सिलाई का काम एक साधारण सिलाई मशीन के जिरए भी किया जा सकता है। इस क्षेत्र में अच्छे स्तर पर स्वयं और अन्य लोगों को स्वरोजगार से जोडऩे काम शुरू करने के लिए अलग-अलग मशीनों का उपयोग जरूरी है। इसमें सिलाई मशीन, पीको मशीन, इंटरलॉक मशीन और एम्ब्रॉयडरी यानी कढ़ाई मशीन आदि शामिल हैं। सिलाई के लिए एक घरेलू यानी बिना पैरदान वाली सिलाई मशीन, जो एक से दो हजार रुपए की आ जाती है, ही काफी है, लेकिन बड़े स्तर पर या बुटिक खोलने पर आधुनिक मशीनों का उपयोग जरूरी है। मोटे तौर पर कहें तो मार्केट में इस काम को शुरू करने के लिए कम से कम 15 से 20 हजार रुपए से काम की शुरुआत की जा सकती है।

कमाई

सिलाई एक ऐसा कार्य है, जिसमें कम लागत से बड़ा मुनाफा तक हासिल किया जा सकता है। पांच रुपए धागा दिन में दो से पांच सौ रुपए तक की कमाई का जरिया बन सकता है। अलस्ट्रेशन से शुरूआत कर नए काम के जरिए अच्छी कमाई की जा सकती है। काम बढऩे के साथ सिलाई करने वाले युवक-युवितयों को जॉब वर्क तक दिया जा सकता है। कई महिलाएं दुकान, शो-रूम या बुटिक से ड्रेस फिटिंग के काम लेती है। एक घरेलू सिलाई मशीन से आसानी से आसानी से तीन से पांच हजार रुपए महीने कमाए जा सकते है। यहीं काम दुकान लगाकर केवल एक सिलाई मशीन से पांच हजार से दस हजार रुपए प्रति माह कमाए जा सकते। बुटीक खोलकर आमदनी को कई गुणा बेहतर किया जा सकता है।

लोन की सुविधा

निजी स्तर पर नजदीकी बैंक से लोन लिया जा सकता है। इसके लिए जिस जगह कार्य की शुरुआत करनी है उस जगह की रजिस्ट्री, पावर ऑफ अटॉर्नी या रेंट एग्रीमेंट जैसे डोक्यूमेंट देकर लोन लिया जा सकता है। बैंक में सिलाई से जुड़े किसी संस्थान का सर्टिफिकेट के साथ एड्रेस और आईडी प्रूफ की जरूरत रहती है। खादी ग्रामोद्योग से प्रशिक्षण प्राप्त किया है तो प्रधानमंत्री रोजगार सृजन कार्यक्रम के तहत सर्टिफिकेट पर लोन ले सकते हैं। इसके लिए एससी/ एसटी/ महिलाओं/ शारीरिक विकलांग/ अल्पसंख्यकों को ग्रामीण क्षेत्र के लिए 35 प्रतिशत और शहरी क्षेत्र के लिए 25 प्रतिशत की छूट मिलती है, जबिक अन्य को ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में 25 प्रतिशत व शहरी क्षेत्र में 15 प्रतिशत छूट का प्रावधान है। इसमें अधिकतम लोन की सीमा पच्चीस लाख रुपए है।

बारहवीं पास के लिए कोर्स

सुखाडिय़ा विश्वविद्यालय उदयपुर के सामाजिक एवं मानविकी महाविद्यालय (आटर्स कॉलेज) में संचालित डिप्लोमा इन फैशन डिजाइनिंग एवं डिप्लोमा इन टैक्सटाइल डिजाइनिंग का कोर्स युवक-युवितयां 12 वीं पास करने के बाद कर सकते है। यहां से इन विषयों में डिप्लोमा कर चुके छात्र-छात्राएं अपने स्तर पर सिलाई जैसे कार्य को अपनी आजीविका बना चुके है। इसमें घरेलू महिलाएं भी शामिल हैं जिन्होंने शादी के बाद कई सालों के अंतराल में बारहवीं

कक्षा के बूते प्रवेश लेकर कोर्स को पूरा किया। इनमें कई महिलाएं ऐसी है जिन्होंने इस कोर्स को न केवल अपनी आजिविका बनाने में उपयोग लिया बल्कि दूसरों को भी रोजगार देने का कार्य किया।

सिलाई मशीन का इतिहास:

- 1790 में सबसे पहले लंदन में थॉमस सेंट ने लकड़ी और पीतल की सिलाई मशीन बनाई।
- 1830 में फ्रांस के टेलर थीमोनियर ने लकड़ी की सिलाई मशीन बनाई।
- 1832 में अमेरिका के वाल्टर हंट ने सिलाई मशीन बनाई।
- 10 सितंबर 1846 अमेरिका के एलियास होव ने को अपनी सिलाई मशीन का पेटेंट कराया।
- 10 सितंबर को अंतरराष्ट्रीय सिलाई मशीन दिवस के रूप में मनाया जाता है।

सिलाई मशीन

सिलाई मशीन एक ऐसा उपकरण है जो किसी वस्त्र या अन्य चीज को परस्पर एक धागे या तार से सिलने के काम आती है। इनका आविष्कार प्रथम औद्योगिक क्रांति के समय में हुआ था। सिलाई मशीनों से जहां फैशनेबल ड्रेस डिजाइनिंग वाले कपड़े ही तैयार नहीं किए जा सकते बल्कि बैग, बेडशीट्स, कर्टन, ब्लैंककेट आदि को तरह-तरह की डिजाइनों में तैयार किया जा सकता है।

सिलाई करने वाली दो हजार से अधिक प्रकार की मशीनों का उपयोग अलग-अलग चीजों को बनाने में उपयोग में लिया जाता है। केवल कपड़ों से डे्रस ही नहीं बल्कि चमड़े इत्यादि से बनने वाले उत्पाद के लिए भी उपयोग में ली जाती है। यहां तक अब मशीनों का उपयोग बटन टांकने, काज बनाने, कसीदा आदि के लिए किया जाता है। केवल हाथ से ही नहीं अब बिजली से चलने वाली मशीनों का उपयोग ज्यादा होने लगा है। भारत में सिलाई मशीन

भारत में भी उन्नीसवीं शताब्दी के अंत तक मशीन आ गई थी। इसमें दो मुख्य थीं, अमरीका की सिंगर तथा इंग्लैंड की 'पफ'। स्वतंत्रता के बाद भारत में भी मशीनें बनने लगीं जिनमें उषा प्रमुख तथा बहुत उन्नत है। सिंगर के आधार पर मेरिट भी भारत में ही बनती है। भारत में 1935 में कोलकाता (कलकत्ता) के एक कारखाने में उषा नाम की पहली सिलाई मशीन बनी। मशीन के सारे पुर्जें भारत में ही बनाए गए थे। अब तो भारत में तरह-तरह की सिलाई मशीनें बनती हैं। उन्हें विदेशों में भी बेचा जाता है।

Architecture is the study of learning the art and science of designing a physical structure be it buildings, communities, skyscrapers, artificial constructions etc. This work includes both ideation and designing of a structure and extends to monitoring the actual construction.

Architecture as a career option is very rewarding going forward due to the immense need of good professionals in this field.

Departmentorganized a one day skill development training for college students on various techniques of Gota Patti. More than 60 students participated and learnt various techniques during training. The designs and motifs were inspired by nature like birds (peacock, parrot, sparrow), human figures (Banithani), animals (elephant, horse), etc. The contemporary designs like paisley, geometrical, palanquin, checker board were also explored. These motifs were structured into buta, butties and cut into various shapes like flower pot (Gamla), Keri (Mango) and champak flower, and stitched with the base fabrics by chain stitch or by hemming.

In this workshop relation between costume, design and colour was demonstrated to participants. Dr. Dolly Mogra further inspired the students to utilize the learned skills for economic earnings.

Akola is a craft cluster in the Udaipur district of Rajasthan .The Akola Region is renowned for hand block printing. The Dabu or mud resist printing of this region is of two specific type namely phetia and nanga. The resist is made by local gum \bedja and oil and the previously used resist by boiling for several hours. The napthol dyed cloth is stamped with the metal blocks. The ash dust is rubbed on the surface to avoid hot resist to stick when folded. Three types of mud resist are used, chuna\lime or kirana is the weakest resist which is used for fine outlines. Mud is used when the cloth needs to be immersed in indigo a few times and sand, the strongest of resist is used for more absorbent colours like pomegranate and ferrous dyes. This process was demonstrated by Manish cheepa to 30 students. Staff members Dr. Dolly Mogra and Shikha also assisted in learning and block printing the fabric.
